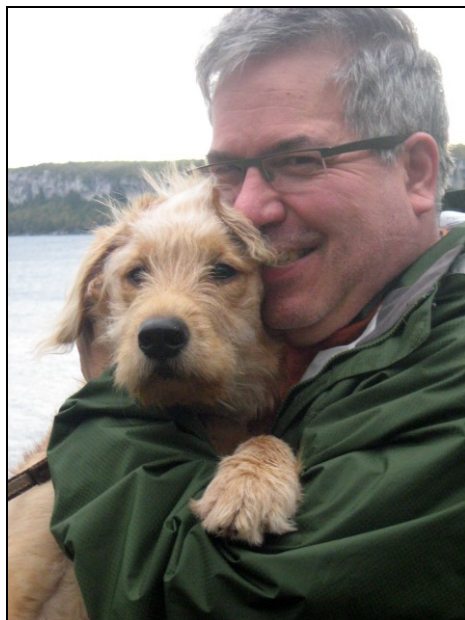


Mitch Bondy

“Children’s Choir Camp” Conductor



Mitch Bondy teaches vocal music at Northlea Public School in Toronto, cultivating a Grade 1-6 choral music program that has earned wide respect and acclaim. In 2008, the Northlea Junior Choir won the The Florine Deprés Award for elementary school choirs 12 years and under across Canada.

Over the past 25 years, Mitch has contributed to leading children’s choirs in Toronto, including 11 years as Assistant Conductor of the Toronto Children’s Chorus. He currently chairs the Artistic Advisory Committee for the High Park Choirs of Toronto.

Mitch has enjoyed working at many camps and festivals throughout Ontario and the Maritimes, including Toronto District School Board music camps, and summer children’s choir camps for Choirs Ontario, Nova Scotia Choral Federation and New Brunswick Choral Federation. He is frequently in demand as an adjudicator with the Toronto Catholic District School Board and a mentor for music teachers within the Toronto District School Board.

He holds an Honours Bachelor of Music degree from the University of Western Ontario, and earned his Master of Education from the University of Toronto. He also studied on scholarship at the Banff School of Fine Arts and the Royal College of Music in England.

Mitch has been awarded the Queen’s Golden Jubilee Medal, “awarded to those persons who have made significant contributions to Canada, to their community and to their fellow Canadians.”
