Tony Leong holds a Master of Education degree in Computer Applications, a Bachelor of Music degree, and is currently completing a Doctor of Philosophy degree at the University of Toronto.. Mr. Leong has studied with Paul Meyer on Violin, Rivka Golani, Daniel Blackman and Rennie Regehr on Viola while studying both orchestral and choral conducting with Professors Dwight Bennett and Lori-Anne Dolloff. He has also participated in master classes and chamber music coaching with such eminent musicians as the Orford String Quartet, the St. Lawrence Quartet, Lorand Fenyves, Simon Fryer, and Scott St. John.

Currently, Mr. Leong is the conductor of the Korean Canadian Youth Symphony Orchestra; Oakwood C.I. Orchestras; National Music Camp of Canada Symphonic and Concert Orchestras; the Music by the Lake Concert Orchestra; and previously, the Royal Conservatory of Music Baroque Orchestra; and the Etobicoke Suzuki School of Music Orchestras. Mr. Leong has also been a member of the Korean Canadian Symphony Orchestra as a violist for over a decade.

In addition, Mr. Leong has given presentation across Canada and the USA as a Technology and String Education clinician and adjudicator, as well as being a Clinician trainer for Finale and SmartMusic Studio. Mr. Leong is a member of the Ontario Music Educators' Association's board of directors and is also the co-editor of their publication, "*The Recorder*". Mr. Leong is also an instructor at Queen's University and has been a past member on the Board of Directors of the Coalition for Music Education in Canada.
